

## Looking for Love? Single Young Adults' Interest in Participation in Romantic Activities





## Background

Because romantic involvement is a salient developmental task during young adulthood, it is commonly assumed that single young adults are actively exploring their options for romantic partnering. Yet, not all single young adults are interested in romantic relationships. In the present study we explored which romantic activities single young adults are engaging in. We also tested if interest and/or engagement in romantic activities were associated with romantic relationship interest and/or how they felt about being single.

We used data from the single participants (N = 140) from the Relationship Histories Survey, a sample of 18 to 35-year-olds recruited via Qualtrics Panel Services. We provided participants with a list of 13 romantic activities and asked participants if they engaged in the activity since they have been single (see figure below). We also asked participants how true it was that they found being single empowering or disappointing. Finally, we asked participants who much they wanted to be in a romantic relationship.


