# Research

#### **Research Statement**

My research endeavors are broadly focused on the management practices of sport organizations. More specifically, I seek to advance sport employees' professional growth and examine the resulting influence on organizational performance. To do so, I utilize the paradigm of positive organizational behavior, which is grounded in the tradition of cultivating personal growth and creating a sustainable competitive advantage (i.e., superior functionality) for employees and organizations. My research line is grounded within human development principles and is designed to expand sport employees' skillsets. I have utilized concepts such as psychological capital, psychological well-being, and creativity to produce a bottom-up approach (i.e., employee focused) in building sport organizations' capacity to serve other stakeholders. The scope of my research is consequently voluminous in that it is critical to understand a multitude of psychological capacities, social interactions, and institutional forces that dictate the potential for sport employees' professional development and enhanced organizational performance. In all, the objective of my research line is twofold: (1) to develop innovative management resources and practices that are designed to stimulate professional growth among sport employees in order to (2) improve sport organizations' performance thereby enabling enhanced experiences of sport stakeholders.
