Bio Sketch

Gonzalo A. Bravo is a Professor of Sport Management in the School of Sport Sciences at West Virginia University's College of Applied Human Sciences. Since 2004, he has taught both undergraduate and graduate courses in sport management. He holds a master's degree in Sport Administration from Penn State University and a Ph.D. in Sport Management from The Ohio State University.

Bravo's research focuses on sport policy and governance, organizational behavior in sport, and sport in Latin America. He has published 62 works, including peer-reviewed articles and book chapters, with his research appearing in leading journals such as the *International Journal of Sport Management and Marketing, Managing Sport and Leisure, International Journal of Sport Policy and Politics,* and the *Journal of Sport Management*. In addition, he has authored six books—one of which is now in its third edition—and contributed to four technical reports commissioned by major organizations, including the International Council for Coaching Excellence, the Organizing Committee of the ICF Canoe Slalom World Championship, and Japan's Research and Science Agency.

Bravo has delivered 128 presentations at academic conferences worldwide, including events organized by the North American Society for Sport Management, the North American Society for the Sociology of Sport, the European Sport Management Association, the Ibero-American Association of Sport Management and Economics, and the International Society for Comparative Physical Education and Sport. He has also been invited to speak at universities and sport organizations across 14 countries, including the United States, Canada, Mexico, Brazil, Chile, Colombia, India, Venezuela, Spain, Zimbabwe, China, Macao, Korea, and Portugal. In 2015, he presented to Brazil's House of Representatives and Ministry of Sport on global sport systems.

In 2014, Bravo was a visiting scholar at the University of Pittsburgh's Center for Latin American Studies. He completed a sabbatical in 2016 at the Center for Sport and Leisure at Universidade Federal do Paraná in Brazil and another in 2023 at the Pan-American and Parapan American Games in Santiago, Chile. From 2022 to 2025, he served on the Board of Directors of the American Kinesiology Association.

Before transitioning to academia in 2001, Bravo spent 11 years as the Sport Director at Fundación Club Deportivo Universidad Católica in Santiago, Chile.
